National Child Day is celebrated on November 20th to honour our commitment to uphold the rights of children and youth in Canada. This special day commemorates two historic events: the 1959 signing of the UN Declaration of the Rights of the Child and the adoption of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1989. This year, the theme for Children First Canada’s National Child Day event is **#8MillionEmpowered**

There is a rising movement of young leaders and changemakers who are standing up for the rights of 8 million children to enjoy their childhood!

Children and youth make up a quarter of our population and 100% of our future. They are the next generation of business leaders, teachers, doctors, activists and politicians.
